# UNEXPECTED MAJOR EXPENSE FOR PARISH!

June 14, 2011

Dear Parishioners:

Just after Memorial Day weekend, we encountered major problems with the HVAC units on top of the Church which provide heat and air conditioning to the main body of the Church. Those who attended the vigil Mass for the Feast of the Ascension felt the difference in the temperature of the Church. The week of June 5<sup>th</sup> we encountered the extremely high temperatures which felt like 100 degrees. On Wednesday, June 8<sup>th</sup> we had graduation in the Church and by the end of the ceremony the temperature of the air coming out of the vents on the “choir side” of the Church was 82 degrees. The next morning we shut that system down. There by the grace of God, the HVAC unit on the “baptismal side” of the Church, and with the cooler temperatures the weekend of June 11/12, the Church was comfortably kept at 70 degrees. This unit is about to go out on us any day.

The HVAC units are the original from ones when the Church was built in 1989, so they are 22 years old. We have a yearly maintenance contract for all the units on the Church premises. Confronted with this emergency situation to replace both units, I informed the Bishop that after getting a few bids I was going to sign a contract to replace them. Normally I would have to go before the Diocesan College of Consultors for permission. The Chancery understood the severity of the situation and supported my decision.

At my Masses the weekend of June 11/12, I shared that the cost to replace these two units is \$45,000. The cost covers the removal the existing (2) 20 ton rooftop units and install (2) Lennox 20 ton gas heat and electrical cooling units which are also equipped with economizers, enthalpy controls, low ambient kits and return air duct detectors. They will have to fabricate and install (2) curb adapters to adapt the new units to the existing roof curbs. Thanks be to God no roofing is required. They will have to reconnect and extend the gas piping as needed and all new gas piping on the roof will be painted as per our local codes. The company will furnish the lifting and rigging crane to complete the replacement. As you can imagine this emergency situation and major capital expense has caught the parish by surprise. I have negotiated with the company a 60 day payment of this bill – (2 payments). The new fiscal year begins on July 1<sup>st</sup> and the parish will experience a major loss of funds. When I appealed to you to help with the unusually harsh winter and high snow removal bills, once again through your generosity we collected \$20,487, which was a great blessing!

As a parish family we come together in times of need. With this in mind I proposed to the parish Pastoral Board to have a “Christmas in July” collection to help with the \$45,000 expense to replace the 2 HVAC units and they also felt the parishioners would support this special appeal. God willing the new units will be installed on Thursday, June 16<sup>th</sup> and when you come to Church on June 18/19 we will be back to “normal.”
