### MEDITATION FOR JULY 3rd

*No one knows the Father but the Son, and those to whom he is revealed by the Son.*

There is a fundamental unity between God the Father and the Son evident in today's Gospel. Because of this unity, Jesus is the only one who truly knows the Father and is the One who reveals to us the depths of the Father's love, as well as his plan for salvation. We are blessed to know the Father's love through Jesus.

Zechariah's words offer hope as they tell of how a king will come to Israel, bringing salvation and the promise of peace to all nations. The second reading calls us to die to sin by the power of the Spirit, so we may live. In the Gospel, Jesus invites all who are burdened to come to him and find rest.

When we think of being good stewards, we may think that God asks too much of us by asking us to generally share our time, talent and treasure. However, the yoke of stewardship is not heavy.
