I am writing to you in regards to our mandatory Summer Keyboarding program. It is imperative that each student practices and maintains this skill over the summer months, as it may be necessary for each student to have the ability to take their Terra Nova tests next year using a keyboard, and not a pencil and paper. By September, each student should know where all the letter keys are on the keyboard and they will be tested on that knowledge throughout the next school year.

Your children have been using the free typing website, **Typing Club** in Computer Class this year, so I would like them to continue using it over the summer to practice their keyboarding skills. Please use this information to log into their accounts:

When you log in to **Typing Club**, you will see the lessons on the right hand corner called Typing Basics and you will begin with the current lesson, and cannot proceed to the next lesson until you finish each one in order. Please **DO NOT** allow the children to change their passwords or edit anything else in their account. There are **100** lessons available, so there is more than enough to keep the students busy all summer. **ALL THE LESSONS DO NOT HAVE TO BE COMPLETED THIS SUMMER**just have the students practice at least once or twice a week or more if they are struggling with this skill.
